We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER), which provides key information on the 2022-23 educational progress for Michigan Center Jr/Sr High. The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and state laws. The school's report contains information about student assessment, accountability, and teacher quality. For the 2023-24 school year, schools were identified based on previous years' performance using definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that had at least one underperforming student subgroup in 2022-23. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that had a student subgroup performing at the same level as the lowest 5% of all schools in the state in 2021-22. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance was in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state or had a graduation rate at or below 67% in 2021-22. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no label is given.

2. Our school improvement plan includes goals for Whole Child (Positive Behavior Intervention Supports), English Language Arts, and Mathematics. We will continue to work on MTSS system processes, student engagement, and a Balanced Assessment System.
3. The implementation of and review of the Michigan Center School District curriculum is supported by district and building-level professional development along with monitoring by building principals and the central office staff. This ensures appropriate instruction and equitable access to the curriculum for all students.
